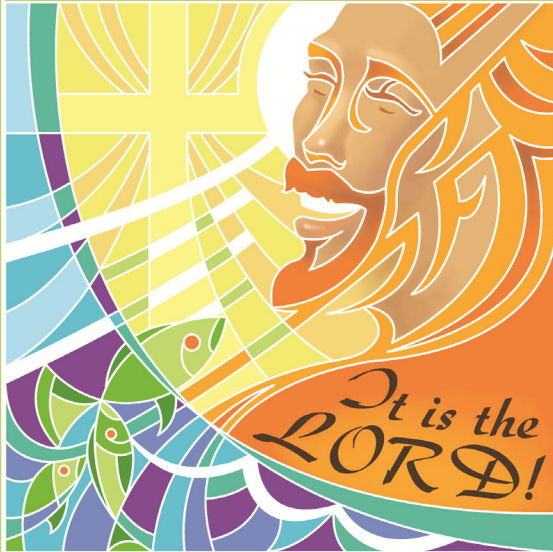

# A Reflection

## The Third Sunday of Easter

The subject of today's readings is authority. There are two types of authority, functional authority, which works from the outside (for example, a CEO, teacher, parent) and personal authority, which works within us and which Jesus had and which He also urges on us.

Today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles recounts the Apostles' testimony before the Sanhedrin for the second time. Remember that the Sanhedrin was the Supreme Council and Court of Justice. The first time they were brought before the Sanhedrin, they were released with a stern warning not to teach or speak of Jesus again. We all know how far that warning went! This time, it was more serious. They actually wanted to execute the Apostles. After the charges were read against them, note how Peter responds by saying "We must obey God rather than men" (personal authority over functional authority).

Reginald H. Fuller in his *Preaching the Lectionary: The Word of God for the Church Today* adds this additional comment – "The most striking feature here is the concept, highlighted in the caption to this reading, of a double witness—the apostles and the Holy Spirit (cf. John 15:26). The Spirit and the apostolic word are both necessary. Without the Spirit, the word becomes a dead formula, no longer speaking meaningfully to the contemporary situation, while without the word; the Spirit becomes uncontrolled enthusiasm divorced from the original witness to the Christ-event". Again they were released by the Sanhedrin with a warning but first they had the Apostles scourged, which was extremely painful. Yet the Apostles rejoiced in all that they had suffered for Him because they were witnesses to Jesus' death and resurrection.

The Gospel reading is taken from the last chapter of John's Gospel, chapter 21. This last chapter, or epilogue, seems to have been added after the Gospel was completed, by a disciple of John. It recounts another post resurrection appearance by Jesus. In this case, Peter and the Apostles decide to

return to their original trade - fishing. They fish all night and catch nothing. Then Jesus (unrecognized) on the shore tells them to cast their nets to the right. They then catch a huge amount of fish. Remember that it was a similar scenario when Jesus first called Peter. John then recognizes Jesus and Peter jumps into the water and swims to shore. The second section describes the commissioning of Peter by Jesus to "feed my lambs", "tend my sheep", and "feed my sheep". It is only through personal authority that this can be accomplished. Finally, there is the foretelling of Peter's death, which is the only reference throughout the New Testament.

## Faith Formation Corner

For this week's Faith Formation Corner we are going to reflect on the ways Jesus continues to reveal himself to us. Before we begin, I invite you to quiet yourself by taking a few full deep breaths and exhaling fully so that your breathing slows and you can bring yourself to this present moment with more awareness.

In numerous resurrection accounts we are told that the disciples do not initially recognize Jesus. He is recognized for breaking bread at a meal, for saying their name, for showing his wounds, and for miracles. How might Jesus reveal himself today? Do you believe Jesus has revealed himself in ways that you or others may have missed because of all the distractions in our daily lives? As a member of the Body of Christ, is it possible that you have helped someone to experience Jesus' presence through your friendship or kindness? As you prayerfully reflect on your life, when were the times that you may not have initially recognized Jesus' presence but then were made aware through God's grace?

As we continue into the Easter season, let us ask Jesus for the grace to be his presence in the world. Let us also ask Jesus for a greater awareness of the ways he continues to reveal himself to us personally.
